## sCCA Club Racing Time Trials Program a Hit in 2005, stage set for Huge 2006 By Curtis Kitchen

TOPEKA, Kan. (Nov. 21, 2005) - Playing the role of new kid on the block in 2005, it didn't take the revamped SCCA Club Racing Time Trials program long to make a ton of friends.

The impact in the first season since its rebirth within Club Racing was so great, in fact, that those who took part in a Time Trials event at some level can't wait for year number two, which appears ready to wallop the first year's success.

Dave Deborde, Regional Executive of SCCA Reno Region, took a chance on getting the Time Trials program rolling in his area and said it opened the eyes of many who may not have otherwise ever gotten involved in motorsports, much less SCCA.
"The Time Trials program gave us the opportunity to offer a new venue to motorsports enthusiasts within the Great Basin area," Deborde said. "We were able to offer a PDX and a Track Trials at the Reno-Fernley Raceway and four weekends of Club Trials at a small airport in Lovelock, Nev.
"Because of the Time Trials program, 10-12 new members have joined SCCA."

Regions also face the challenge of retaining members. Time Trials, Deborde said, provides a way for that to happen while exposing them to different avenues within racing that they may not have known previously.
"Perhaps just as important," Deborde said, "is the fact that many existing inactive members have become active and are involved in the Club in the Time Trials program. Over the 2005 season, approximately 55 people have been exposed to flagging or other specialties that will be necessary to initiate a Club Racing program within the Region."

The number of officials for the program is on the rise, not just in Reno Region, but across the country. According to statistics compiled by SCCA Club Racing, licensed officials for the Time Trials program also increased, up a whopping 86 percent - or nearly double the number of officials in the program this time last year.

Chuck DeProw, of Wentzville, Mo., took part in a PDX this year and said the effort was well worth it.
"To take your car out on a road course is a thrill in itself," DeProw said. "You were with your friends and everyone thought he or she was Michael Andretti. We were allowed to pass on the straights by hand signals only. At the end of the session, we talked about our lines, how our cars handled, where
to brake and when we could get to do it again!
"I'm looking forward to doing the program again in 2006 with more experience and a lot of new friends to drive with."

DeProw, and all others who anxiously await the new Track Trials year, will have plenty of opportunity to "do it again!" as 2006 looks to catapult off of 2005's success.

This year, Performance Driving Experiences (PDX) doubled, up to 25 events from 12 in 2004. Club Trials made the largest jump, getting drivers to the track 18 times in 2005 after only having three events the prior year. Track Trials increased 100 percent, going from 10 events to 20, and Hill Climbs added an event as well as competitors attacked mountain sides eight times.

Overall, Time Trials events increased 45 percent as the total number of events rose from 32 to 70 this season.
"We set substantial goals in terms of growth for the Time Trials program, and on many levels, it exceeded what we set," SCCA Club Racing Director Terry Ozment said. "The regions that were able to take part in the program found it to be well worth the effort. We hope that even more Regions learn firsthand how beneficial Time Trials can be for their local members, and, based on the overwhelming positive
feedback we received, we can't wait to see what happens with Time Trials in 2006."
More expansion is expected in 2006. Some of that growth will come in the form of an expanded PDX program. More could come in the form of a three or four event Club Trials National Series. And though it is far from a new event, the Duryea Hill Climb in Reading, Pa. will reach an unheard of milestone when participants tackle the mountain for the 100th time.

The message is clear: Time Trials events benefit everyone involved, from the Region that hosts the event to the people, both new and experienced, who drive in them. And with the program's popularity skyrocketing, now is the perfect time for novices to take part in an event and Regions to get Time Trials on the 2006 schedule.

## Progress on A/I Fronts

At this writing, October 15, the last runoffs at MidOhio (for the time) have been completed very successfully, the SCCA Pro Racing Speed World Challenge is drawing to a close (I'm at Mazda Raceway Laguna Seca for the final event of the year), and the search for a new President is well under way.

At the Runoffs, the organizational excellence of the SCCA Club Racing staff, led by Director of Club Racing Terry Ozment, and the SCCA member volunteers who attended in record numbers, led by Chief Steward Gerry Wannarka were without compare. The community of Richland County was more gracious than ever, and Michelle Trueman of Mid Ohio provided excellent facilities and presented the Board of Directors with a beautiful commemorative wall display for use at our Topeka headquarters. The World Challenge is concluding their best season yet; in yesterday's timed practice, a Porsche, a Dodge Viper, and a Cadillac were within 0.1 second of each other in 2nd, 3rd, and 4th position, which typifies the exciting
competition this series provides for the race fans. Congratulations to Mitch Wright, Garrett Mudd, and Harry Turner and their staffs for a most commendable performance.

The search for a new President is now well under way, with about 50 applications received and more coming in daily. The quality of the applications is really quite amazing. There are at least 10 candidates who are extremely credible; the search committee has begun making the "first cut" and preparing to begin the first round of interviews. At this rate, we could have a new President identified by year end, right on schedule. As I have previously stated, I credit Steve Johnson's leadership with putting us "on the map" as a highly credible, national motorsports organization which can attract the most serious of industry executives to apply for our presidency.

On a personal note, I am really enjoying working with the Headquarters and field staff during this interim. I would like to think that my presence in the Club office has helped to mediate a new level of mutual understanding and cooperation between the Staff and the Board; it will be a high priority with me to transfer this exceptionally close cooperation between Board and Staff to the new President and the New BoD as my term expires at the end of the year.

 2005 Crow Mountain Hillelimb Presented by Unclaimed BaggageA trip to a mountain road just outside Scottsboro, Alabama in December 2003 sparked an idea to get a small region of devoted Sports Car Club of America (SCCA) members to host an event never seen before in North Alabama. A dream became reality on October 1, 2005 when the first car tripped the timing lights for the First Annual Crow Mountain Hill Climb (www.crowmountainhillclimb.org).

Crow Mountain served up a challenging 1.85 mile uphill course with a 720 foot elevation change featuring 7 hairpin switchbacks, 3 separate " 5 " features, some high speed sprint areas, and a $6 / 10$ mile high speed curved section with two blind lefthanders. The fully lined course with granite rock faces and large trees offered no margin for error.

Many car clubs worked this event including the Rocket City Rock Crawlers, North Alabama British Motoring Society, Rocket City Miata Club, Spokes Car Club of Nashuille, Rocket City Mustang Club, UAH-Charger Motorsports, Alabama/ Chattanooga Regions SCCA, Twickenham Auto Club, and the
event organizers-Tennessee Valley Region SCCA. The event was also staffed by the Jackson County HAM radio, Scottsboro Band Boosters, and the Jackson County Tourism Board. In all over 200 workers contributed to this first event!

Fifty-three drivers entered the event, with times ranged from the fastest of 107.825 seconds to 173.456 seconds. As he has become accustomed, George Bowland of Mill Spring, N.C. won "King of the Hill" honors in his snowmobile engine powered Special.
